

VOLUME I REVIEW AND STATUS: BEAD INITIAL PROPOSAL

Purpose:

Affirms adherence to the basic elements of NTIA's guidelines and allows the PBDA to lay the foundation for success.

Public Comment (Closed October 10, 2023):

Includes critical components for the implementation of BEAD funding

- NTIA requirements
- Guidance on elements such as the application process
- Scoring criteria
- Labor standards
- Requirements
- Commonwealth policies.

- NTIA Submission
 - NTIA submission deadline of December 27, 2023
 - NTIA feedback/approval anticipated in early 2024



VOLUME II PURPOSE AND NEED: BEAD INITIAL PROPOSAL

Purpose: Refines and defines the foundational key elements needed to enable successful implementation of BEAD funding.

Released for public comment 10/16/2023!

Includes 15 critical elements, which:

- Confirm for NTIA our adherence to their guidelines and requirements
- Builds the foundation for success
- Leads into our final proposal



Deployment Subgrantee Selection & Non-deployment Subgrantee Selection

A highly detailed approach to eliminate vagueness, produce quality applications, and ensure the greatest positive community impacts.

- The process by which subgrantees will submit project/request details
- Who, What, Where, When, How, Impacts, Sustainability
- Provides accountability for both the applicant and the PBDA
- Extremely critical element in the overall program success






Labor Standards, Protections, & Workforce Readiness,

Advancing equitable workforce development and job quality objectives to develop a skilled and diverse workforce.

- Comprehensive, Equitable and Inclusive Workforce Development
- Promotion of partnerships and training
- On-ramps into broadband-related jobs
- Sustainable job quality and benefits
- Engagement of labor & community-based organizations
- Maintaining worker representation
- Ensuring diversity





Cost and Barrier Reduction

Increasing the efficiency of implementation actions to ensure sustainability and lower the costs of building broadband infrastructure.

- Prioritizing the use of existing infrastructure where possible
- Local government coordination
- Multi-agency permitting coordination
- Right-of-way coordination efforts



A state-wide working group has been established to identify and address permitting and coordination efforts.



Low-Cost Broadband Service Option & Middle-Class Affordability

- Affordable Connectivity Benefit access and eligibility
- Defines and prioritizes basic service level.
- Cost to the subscriber is \$30 per month or less, inclusive of all taxes, fees, and charges.
- Established how high-quality broadband services are available to all middle-class families at reasonable prices.





High-speed internet access is no longer a luxury. Rather, it is a necessity to equally participate in today's economy. Access to high-speed internet helps to ensure public safety, increase opportunities for our businesses and workforce, and provides an equal opportunity for students. The **Broadband Equity. Access. and Deployment (BEAD) program &** appropriates \$42.45 billion for states, territories, the District of Columbia (D.C.), and Puerto Rico (P.R.) to use for broadband deployment, mapping, and adoption projects.

On June 26, 2023, NTIA released state allocations and Pennsylvania has been awarded \$1.16 billion in federal funding. The Authority will now begin designing its Initial Proposal which is due on December 27, 2023.

Volume II of BEAD: Public Comment Period

The Pennsylvania Broadband Development Authority (PBDA) has drafted its **Volume II of the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Proposal.** as required through the National Telecommunication and Information Administration's BEAD Notice of Funding Opportunity and supplemental guidance. Volume II includes critical components of PBDA's plans for implementing BEAD grant funding, to ensure that all Pennsylvanians have access to high-speed internet. To draft the document, PBDA complied with NTIA requirements and guidance on elements such as the application process, scoring criteria, labor standards, and other requirements, as well as Commonwealth policies.

Volume II will be available for public review and comment for the required 30 days, from October 16, 2023 through November 14, 2023. Upon receipt and consideration of comments and Board approval, PBDA will submit the Volume for consideration to the NTIA prior to the submission deadline of December 27, 2023.

The public is asked to share comments by 11:59PM on November 14, 2023.
